

District's help, <u>it's your responsibility to grow your club's membership, its new leaders</u>, and its service to your community.

I have four club visits scheduled in June but there are 9 clubs that have not offered me a visit. I won't be able to visit all these clubs before July 1.

*All clubs should have already held their officer elections and reported the results to LCI using the MyLCI application. Nine clubs have not yet completed this important task. Even if your officers carry forward another year, they still need to be entered into MyLCI for the 2023-2024 Lion year. If not there will not be any officers listedyou're your club July 1. Please do so ASAP! The info is needed by LCI and by the district to produce an accurate district directory.

All clubs should update and verify their member and club information on MyLCI right away. Why? LCI is transitioning to a new and improved member interface application "Lion Portal" which will combine several current LCI databases into one. This is to make access to club and member information simpler to obtain and easier to maintain. All Lions will find this new portal useful where the current applications are focused on assisting club and district officers. In addition, all club officers and Lions are being asked to have a unique email address so LCI can provide information tailored to every Lion's position. Sharing email addresses for multiple club positions will be a problem.

June is your last chance for individual Lions and clubs to contribute to Lions Clubs International's Foundation for this Lion year. You can't earn LCI's Club Excellence award without a contribution no matter how small or large. Thirty-Six clubs and the district have donated \$58,209. This exceeds our goal! But there is a goal of more clubs donating some amount. Go to lionsclubs.org, select LCIF and donate something for your club's participation. Thanks!

Our clubs and district have served **303,365 individuals** so far this Lion year. This number far exceeds the conservative goal of 185,000. <u>Great work Lions!</u>

<u>Don't forget to report your meetings, fundraiser events, service projects and donations on MyLION.</u> Fifty-Two of our clubs (85%) have reported something on MyLION. We have the best percentage of the 16 districts in Texas. But EVERY club should report something unless they are totally inactive. We should be in the 90+ percentage.

Greetings to all the District 2-X1 Lions!

We have only a month left to wrap-up the Lions Year 2022-2023 and I am very excited to see the final achievements of this year. Under the effective and efficient leadership of Governor Fred Conger, our District has already achieved several of the 2022-2023 goals; and I am pretty sure that our District will achieve most of the goals by June 30, 2023. I ask all the clubs to add at least one new member, if possible, by June 30, 2023 as a support to achieve the membership goal. And with support of all the District 2-X1 Lions, we shall continue doing better in the new year 2023-2024. Together we can and together we will!

Currently FVDGE Radha and I are working on the 2023-2024 District Directory, and we are still in need of officers' information from a few Clubs. If you have not entered your Club Officers' information into our Lions Portal, please do so at your earliest convenience. Also, please note that Lions Portal is scheduled to change around Mid-June; the new requirement is that all Lions must have a valid email address (cannot be used the same email address by two Lion members) in the portal. Please update your contact information in the portal at your earliest convenience.

Zone Chairs and Region Chairs are the key District Officers that monitor the activities, provide necessary support, and act as liaison between the District and the Clubs in their respective areas. Zone Chairs are the first contact point for any Clubs for any needed support from the District. Therefore, I encourage all Clubs to stay in close contact with their respective Zone Chairs and Region Chairs. We will have three Region Chairs and eleven Zones Chairs, in Lions Year 2023-2024, who will be supporting all the Clubs in their Regions and/or Zones.

Along with other District goals, membership growth is the most important goal of our District in Lions Year 2023-2024, which is also the principal goal of the MD-2. Therefore, I ask all the Clubs to focus on adding new members and prevent dropouts. All Zone Chairs shall closely monitor the membership status of the Clubs in their Zones, on a regular basis, and shall coordinate with the Club President and Membership Chair for any

needed action to improve the memberships. In case of any decrease in membership (negative membership growth), the Zone Chairs and/or Region Chairs are advised to report it to the District Global Action team (GAT) and seek their support to cure the issue.

The number of Specialty Clubs are on the rise, according to the LCI worldwide database, which proves that a Lions Club that represents the interest of a certain group of people is gaining worldwide popularity. I think that our District, being a densely populated district with demographic diversity, has high possibility of opening a few Specialty Clubs that focus on a specific area like environment, health, education (Student Club), work specific, ethnic, etc. As well, I think opening a new Corporate Lions Club (a Lions Club established within an Office or representing that Office) is highly possible in our District, as there are several big corporate houses in Dallas. If any of you work for a big corporation/entity and would like to establish a new Lions Club in your office, please let us know; our Global Action Team (GAT) will be more than happy to assist you on this. In this context, our Specialty Club Coordinator Lion Thala Raj Panta has notified me that he has a plan to establish a specialty Lions Club that focuses on the Environment in the near future. And I think it is a commendable plan. Let us work together to establish a few clubs in our District.

District 2-X1 is participating in Global Membership Approach to maximize our membership thereby maximizing our service to the community.

District 2-X1 Goals: Following are the district goals:

- Charter 3 new clubs
- Recruit 400 new members
- Drops to be below 300
- Serve 185,000 needy people in our community
- Net Membership Gain +100



How are we doing?

District 2-X1 has chartered two clubs. The Lumbini Specialty Club and the Dallas Health Club. The Charter night was held on April 1. 2-X1 has applied for a new club 'Plano North Lions Club'. If approved our district would have chartered 3 new clubs. We have a membership drop 0f -5



We have added 334 members in the eleven months and dropped 339

members. The district goal of +100 may be difficult to meet. But if all clubs can recruit at least one new member in the next two months, we can be closer to achieving our goal. Allen Lions Club has been rejuvenated with the addition of 5 new members. We will end with a positive membership growth. The clubs need better planning when dropping members. Prioritize the members to be dropped gradually depending on the circumstances, instead of mass drops. This creates a big dent on district goals.



Our district needs to contain the drops in the month of June and need to focus on aggressive recruitment campaign to meet our goals.

The incoming Governor and the district team met April 19 to form goals for next year. A SWOT analysis has been conducted to identify the current strengths and areas for improvement. The goals are due to LCI by May 30.

Service: The district has served over 303,365 people, 70,415 volunteer hours, and 2202 projects. 81% of the clubs have reported on MyLion. Let us keep all our members engaged. Kudos to the district for exceeding our goals in service. On February 18 the district project 'Build a Bed' was highly successful with over 200 volunteers help build over 175beds. Great team effort. 50 clubs (81%) have reported their service on MyLion, the best in MD-2.

Leadership Training: Club Officers training was already held at 2-X1 LU in June 2022, with several Lion officers in attendance. Zone Chair training was conducted by GMA during State Convention with 35 Zone Chairs in attendance. As a follow up the ZC training was also held virtually. The goal of the district is to train as many Lions as possible to prepare them to be better Lions and serve the clubs and district in leadership positions. Officers training and new member orientation was also conducted during the Mid-Winter conference on January 21. Incoming officers training is planned for June. A zone chair training for incoming zone chairs was held during the State Convention in May 20, 2023. Several Zone Chairs from 2-X1 took advantage of this training.

LCIF Donations: Total donations from the district amounted to \$57,413. Our goal is to raise \$45,000 and have surpassed it. We have about 36% clubs donating.

What's Next? - We still have several clubs with no membership activity and the need to encourage them to hold membership growth events, with the help of Zone Chairs.

- Provide assistance to the 10 clubs with less than 10 members.
- There are 11 clubs with no membership activity.
- District has several ongoing initiatives. The club rebuilding program PCC John Eads and IPDG
 Esme are working with Allen High Noon, Dallas Women's, Ferris and Richardson Host.
 Districtwide service projects have been successful for more membership engagement.
- Clubs to host membership events.
- Several clubs have not reported activities for over 24 months.

District 2-X1 LOFY Contestant Won Awards at the 2023 MD-2 Texas Lions State Contest

One of our District contestants at the LOFY State Contest, Vinay Upadhyay won 1st Place and in Drug Awareness Speech (DAS) contest and 3rd Place in Outstanding Youth Award (OYA) contest held virtually on Saturday, May 6, 2023. Along with certificate awards, Mr. Upadhyay will receive \$3,000 (1st Place) and \$1,000 (3rd Place) scholarship, payable directly to the university he will attend in 2 years.
