This is encouraging; we are committed to continuing this trend in the coming months, as well.

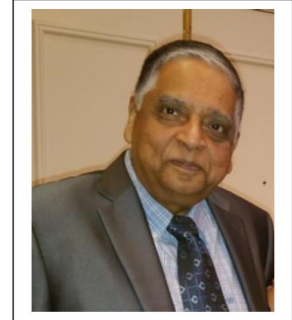

How are we doing ?

District 2-X1 has chartered two clubs. The Lumbini Specialty Club and the Dallas Health Club. The Charter night was held on April 1. We have a membership drop Of -18

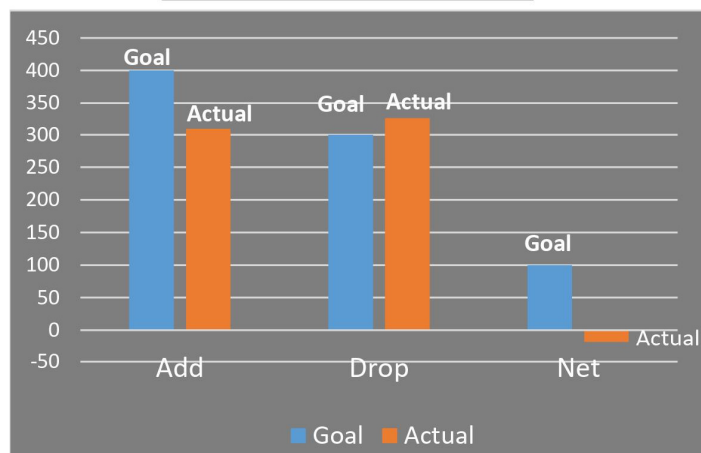

We have added 309 members in the ten months and dropped 327

members. The district goal of +100 may be difficult to meet. But if all clubs can recruit at least one new member in the next two months, we can be closer to achieving our goal . Our district needs to contain the drops and need to focus on aggressive recruitment campaign to meet our goals.

2-X1 Membership Status



The incoming Governor and the district team met last week to form goals for next year. A SWOT analysis has been conducted to identify the current strengths and areas for improvement. The goals are due to LCI by May 30.

Service: The district has served over 270,318 people, 64,614 volunteer hours, and 2089 projects. 81% of the clubs have reported on MyLion. Let us keep all our members engaged. Kudos to the district for exceeding our goals in service. On February 18 the district project 'Build a Bed' was highly successful with over 200 volunteers help build over 175beds. Great team effort. 50 clubs (81%) have reported their service on MyLion, the best in MD-2.

Leadership Training: Club Officers training was already held at 2-X1 LU in June 2022, with several Lion officers in attendance. Zone Chair training was conducted by GMA during State Convention with 35 Zone Chairs in attendance. As a follow up the ZC training was also held virtually. The goal of the district is to train as many Lions as possible to prepare them to be better Lions and serve the clubs and district in leadership positions. Officers training and new member orientation was also conducted during the Mid-Winter conference on January 21. Incoming officers training is planned for June. A zone chair training for incoming zone chairs is also planned during the State Convention in May 2023.

LCIF Donations: Total donations from the district amounted to \$54,443. Our goal is to raise \$45,000 and have surpassed it. We have about 36% clubs donating.

What's Next? - We still have several clubs with no membership activity and the need to encourage them to hold membership growth events, with the help of Zone Chairs.

- Provide assistance to the 10 clubs with less than 10 members.
- There are 11 clubs with no membership activity.
- District has several ongoing initiatives. The club rebuilding program PCC John Eads and IPDG Esme are working with Allen High Noon, Dallas Women's, Ferris and Richardson Host. Districtwide service projects have been successful for more membership engagement.
- Clubs to host membership events.

Selected judges for this contests were composed of :

1. MD, Psychiatrist, Medical Director
2. Instructor & Director of the Dept of Allied Health Program
3. Educator

All contestants will receive certificates to be presented at the District convention luncheon on April 15, 2023.

First Place winner is Mandip Chhetri. He will be awarded a \$1000 Scholarship to UT Austin, where he will attend this fall and will advance to the state LOFY contest. Certificate & \$500 scholarship award will be presented to the 2nd place winner Vinay Upadhyay. Shruti Sunkara , 3rd place will receive certificate . Congratulations to all contestants and to the sponsoring Club, Dallas Everest Lions Club and Dallas Indian Lions Club. We wish Mandip all the best on his next State contest.

2023 LOFY Contests' Winners

LOFY Contests committee received three contestants each for Diabetes Awareness Essay, Drug Awareness Speech, and Outstanding Youth Award contests. All contestants are Leos from District 2-X1; two were sponsored by the Dallas Everest Lions Club and three were sponsored by Dallas the Indian Lions Club and are members of the Dallas Metro Leo Club. Two contestants were disqualified due to failure to meet contests rules' requirement.

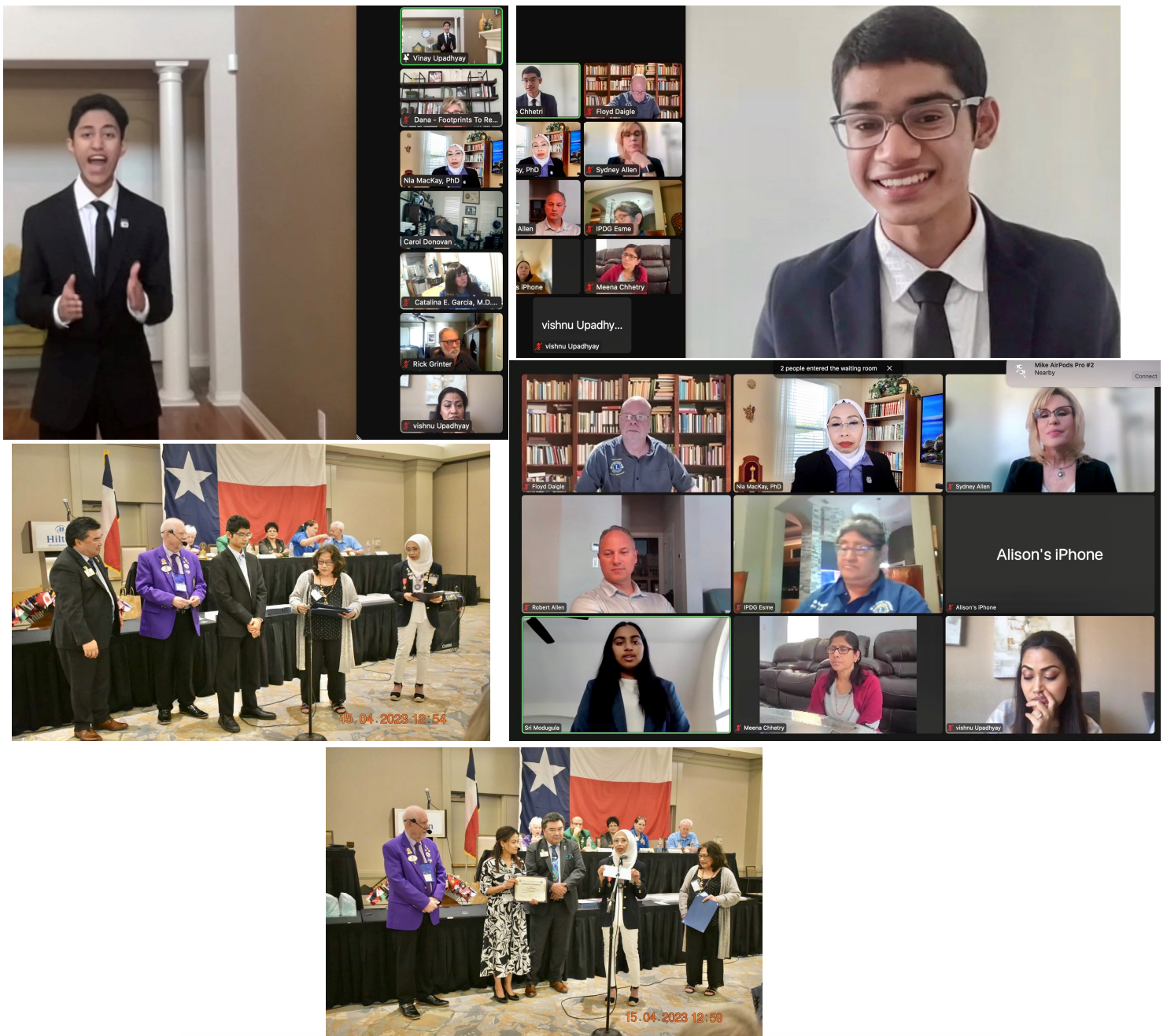
We selected judges based on the topic of the contest and judges' background experience and trainings. We are very fortunate this year to have four judges who are members of the local Toastmasters International. For the Drug Awareness Speech contest the judges were: Catalina Garcia, MD (Anesthesiologist, Toastmasters), Dana Morgan (Substance Use Disorder Recovery Evangelist and Interventionist), Lion Rick Grinter (Toastmasters member), and Lion Hon. Carol Donovan JD (Mediator, Toastmasters). For the Outstanding Youth Award contest the judges were: IPDG Esmeralda Rodriguez (retired educator), Lion Floyd Daigle (MD-2 IT Chairperson/Webmaster), Lion Bobby Allen (Private Business), Lion Alison Allen Grinter JD (Mediator, Toastmasters), and Lion Sydney Allen (IT, Digital Marketing). For the benefit of those who don't know what the Toastmaster is, the Toastmasters International is a nonprofit educational organization that teaches public speaking and leadership skills through a worldwide network of clubs. For the first time, all, but two judges, are active members of various Lions Clubs, one of them is from out side of District 2-X1.

Judging was held simultaneously on Saturday, March 25, 2023. Two contests held via Zoom were Drug Awareness Speech contest (from 10 AM to 12 PM) and Outstanding Youth Award contest (1 to 3 PM). Parents of contestants were allowed to observe the contestants' presentation. First and 2nd Place winners received scholarship (payable to the university/college they will attend) in the amount of \$1,000 and \$500, respectively. Monetary prize should be used within 2 years after winning.

Winners for Diabetes Awareness Contests were Mandip Chhetri (1st Place, Senior, North Richland Uplift Academy), Vinay Upadhyay (2nd, Junior, Sunnyvale HS)-both sponsored by the Dallas Everest LC, and Shruti Sunkara (3rd, Junior, Plano East HS), sponsored by the Dallas Indian LC. Winners for the Drug Awareness Speech contest were Vinay Upadhyay (1st Place), Mandip Chhetri (2nd), and Sneha Kar (3rd, Senior, Plano East HS), sponsored by the Dallas Indian LC. For Outstanding Youth Award contest 1st Place went to Vinay Upadhyay, 2nd Place to Mandip Chhetri, and 3rd Place to Sripoorna Modugula (Junior, Texas Academy of Math and Science, Denton, TX.)

Leo Mandip, 2022-2023 President of District 2-X1 Leo Clubs, received the award certificates and scholarships at the 2023 District Convention, Saturday, April 15, 2023 at the Award Luncheon program. He will attend Texas A&M University in the Fall. Since Leo Vinay was in Philadelphia, PA for a Leadership Training that day, his parent, Lion Dr. Vishnu Maya Upadhyay DNP, accepted the award certificates and scholarship for him. The 3rd winners award certificates and commiseration gifts were presented to the sponsoring club representative at the Convention. DAWN Project Continues Making Impact in the Communities

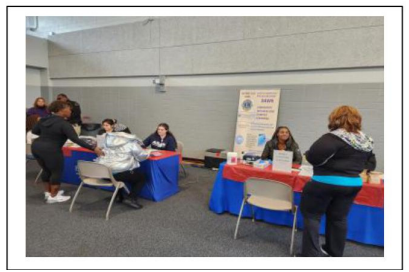
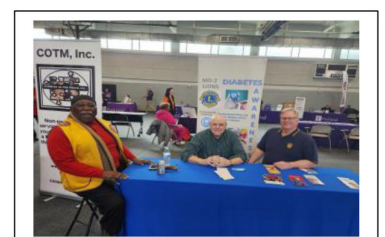
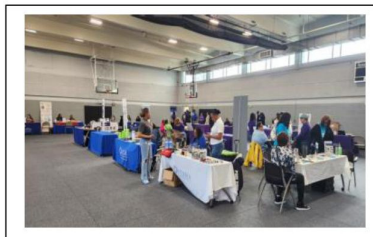
