Greetings, fellow Lions!

Thank you to all the fellow Lions and Clubs for your continuing support to the District. I am incredibly happy with the progress of our District and would like to congratulate you all on the remarkable achievements. Please keep continue doing all the good works; here is our summary progress status for the first five months:

Membership: Our District has chartered three new clubs with over 75 charter members. We added 153 net new members (added 232 and dropped 79) over the past five months. We are in the process of converting one family branch club to the full traditional club; thank you to the Grand Parie Lions Club for this conversion. Please note that LCI has recently announced to honor the sponsors of new Lion members by different awards (distinct types of pins/plaques), so I encourage all Lions to sponsor new Lion members and win the awards.

Service: So far our District has served 205,590 people, has done 1,276 activities, and 89 percent of the clubs are reporting activities. These are very motivating numbers and please continue reporting your club's service activities.

<u>Training:</u> So far 100 percent of the Zone Chairs and 55 percent of the Club Officers in our District have been trained. Another training session for Club Officers is scheduled for December 9th. Our District has already achieved all the District Leadership/Training Goals, and I am extremely happy for these incredible achievements.

<u>Donation:</u> So far 32 Clubs and 47 Individual Lions from our district have donated \$11,857 to the LCIF. Our District LCIF Team is optimistic in achieving the LCIF donation target, \$47,952, this year. I, personally and on behalf of the District, request all Clubs and Individual Lions to donate any amount of your choice by visiting the LCIF donation link:

District 2-X1, November 30, 2023

District 2-X1 is participating in Global Membership Approach to maximize our membership thereby maximizing our service to the community.

District 2-X1 Goals: Following are the district goals:

- Charter 2 new clubs
- Recruit 330 new members
- Drops to be below 280
- Net membership gain 50
- Serve 190,000 needy people in our community



How are we doing?

Clubs: We have chartered three new clubs 'Dallas Denton Nepalese' Club with 20 members. Collin Athena Alliance (31 members) and Irving DFW Independent Campus (24 members). Congratulations and welcome to the new club members and club sponsors.

2-X1 goals for this year, is to recruit 330 new members with the drops limited to 280 for a net membership increase of 50. In five months, we have surpassed that goal with +151. Let us keep the positive momentum going. The key to growth is member retention and 2-X1 has maintained a modest

attrition of members. We have dropped 80 members and added 231. The chart shows 2-X1 goals vs actual. We have done extremely well in new clubs and member recruitment.

GMA focus this year will be on clubs, so they will embrace the GMA process. The 4- step process is simple. Please use this useful tool to better understand your club and how to recruit and retain new members. This will serve as a road map for the club. I will be happy to visit your club or zone meeting and go over it in detail. A GMA workshop will be held in January for Club Presidents. Mission 1.5 is in full swing as the challenge has been accepted by most districts. Let us do our part by chartering new clubs and bringing in new members towards achieving that goal.



Service: In the period July – November, 208,779 people have been served in 1297 service activities with 41,490 volunteer hours. Over 74% of the clubs have reported their activities on MyLion. LCI goal is to serve over a Billion people and every service activity needs to be counted to help achieve that goal.

Leadership Training: Club officers training was already held in June, including Zone Chairs and LCIF. Over 80% zone chairs have attended the training. In addition, training is offered for Club President, Secretary and Treasurer. Approximately 50% of club officers have been trained. A trained Lion makes a better Lion. A GMA training session will be organized around MW Conference, especially for Club Presidents and Zone Chairs.

LCIF Contributions: District 2-X1 has collected \$9,436 towards our foundation during the five months . Please donate generously so the foundation can help more people around the world.

GMA Round Table is held on last Tuesday of the month from 6-7 PM. The purpose of this is to educate and to make aware to the participants about the GMA process, have an open and engaging discussion and to get input from Lions across MD-2. Last Tuesday we had PIP Brian Sheehan as our guest speaker who gave an inspiring presentation. There will be no Round Table in December because of the holidays.

Faith at Work Ministries is a local 501c3 designed to feed those in need. The Mabank Cedar Creek Area Lions Club have been working with them since 2021.

Food is picked up 7 days a week and then redistributed at the Mabank Pavilion every Sunday Afternoon and then on to other food pantries throughout the week. We were able to apply for an LCIF Grant to add a used 72 foot freezer truck/trailer and a 25 foot refrigeration truck. In addition, we purchased a storage trailer for non refrigerated staples.

Our distribution radius is 100-miles around Kaufman County; however, we serve anyone, from any area if they come to our distribution locations located in Kaufman County.

We are feeding an average of around 3,000 people a week based on registrations taken at just at the FAWM distribution point at the Mabank Pavilion, on a weekly basis, averaging 764 boxes of food weighing approximately 65-85 pounds. <u>These numbers are from the FAWM food share alone.</u>







2023-2024 Diabetes Awareness Essay Contest Rules

Essay Subject:

Diabetes is a growing concern in the USA and around the world. One of the reasons why the incidence of diabetes is rising is because of unawareness. As a society, we should promote awareness, and one way to do this is to educate young people about diabetes. What is diabetes, signs, and symptoms, and how can diabetes be prevented and managed?

In this essay, contestants are asked to define and write about the various types of diabetes, identify the symptoms and health issues related to diabetes as well as medical treatments available to people with diabetes. The essay should include information about healthy meals and lifestyle changes that can help individuals manage their diabetes or blood sugar. Contestants are encouraged to interview and include personal stories from individuals with diabetes, medical practitioners or diet nutritionists caring for individuals with diabetes. The essay must be well organized, have good vocabulary and conform to required length.

Basic Rules and Qualifications (Eligibility)

- Contestant *must* be sponsored by a Lions Club from District 2-X1
- A Club may sponsor only one contestant for every contest by submitting contest entry application, associated documents, and the entry fee to the District Contest Chair.
- Application fee is \$100 per contestant, provided by the sponsoring Lions Club, payable to '2-x1 Charities Inc.'
- A false statement on the entry application or associated document causes disqualification with the entry fee being forfeited. There shall be no refund on any entry fee.
- A contestant can apply for multiple contests at both District 2X1 and MD-2 state LOFY contest.
- Contestant <u>must</u> be Junior or Senior high school enrolled in a secondary educational institution (public or private school) or comparable educational program in District 2X1
- The title of the contestant's essay doesn't have to be the same as the subject for the essay, however, the essay should analyze the problem given in the subject and present a solution or solutions to the problem
- The essay should not exceed 1,500 words, exclude cited bibliography.
- Award and monetary award (TBD) will be given to 1st and 2nd place winners.
 A Club may sponsor only one contestant for every contest by submitting contest entry application, associated documents, and the entry fee to the District Contest Chair.
- Only the First place winner will advance to participate in the State level competition to be held on line on May 4, 2024.

Responsibility of the Contestants

• Each contestant shall submit the following to the sponsoring Lions Club, all in the application packet: Completed District 2X1 Contest Application, can be found on this link:

https://lionsdistrict2X1.org/forms/

- Four (4) copies of typed, double-spaced essay, including Bibliography. Essay changes are not permitted once received by the District Contest Coordinator
- -Two (2) high quality wallet size/passport photographs , , head and shoulder, glossy and in color. Photos not meeting this requirement will not be included in the contest souvenir booklet.
- Signed copy of Code of Conduct* and Chaperone Guidelines*.
- Signed Medical Power of Attorney* designating contestants Chaperones as Primary Responsible Party* and the State Contest chair as the Secondary Responsible Party.
- -Failure to send **ALL** items above will result in *disqualification*
- All contestants must be able to participate in the contest using online live audio and video communication via ZOOM on Saturday March 23, 2024 starting at 9:00 AM
 - * Copies of State's LOFY contest rules/ forms are available at MD-2 website at : https://texaslions.org/diabetesessay-contest/
- Prior to the contest, contestants and club sponsors will be provided with additional instruction for the on-line contest to be use by the contest chair on Friday March 15, 2024

Responsibility of the Sponsoring Club:

- Where do we find contestant(s)?
 - School principals, counselors, and/or Science/English teachers.
 - Youth Groups and Youth Programs.
 - Family, friends or colleague
- Application fee is \$100 per contestant, provided by the sponsoring Lions Club, payable to '2-x1 Charities Inc, attached to application packet.
- Sponsoring Club must ensure **all** documents listed above (see Responsibility of the Contestant documents) are completed and signed for each contestant to be sent to the Contest Chair listed in the Contest Rules (last Page).

Deadline post mark will be Wednesday Mar. 1, 2024

- Complete the "Contestant Checklist" and place it on top of the completed application packet.
- At the State level contest, chaperone/sponsoring Club must comply with the requirements set forth in the MD-2 Texas Lions LOFY contest Chaperone Guidelines

Contest Rules

- a. The Title of the Contestant's essay is not required to be the same as the Subject for the essay. Contestants should be creative in the selection of an essay title and set the tone for their presentation with the title they choose.
- b. The essay should analyze the problem given in the subject and present a solution or solutions to the problem.
- c. The topic is broad and allows the contestants considerable leeway in the selection of their solution or solutions.
- d. Creative, innovative, practical and reasonable ideas are welcome.
- e. Each Contestant shall personally research, write and read his/her contest essay.

- f. Research for this topic can be conducted by interviewing physicians, nurses, medical professionals, community organizations and by using the internet and library. The essay shall be a written article, to be read by the Contestant, to be judged by a panel of judges in competition with other Contestants.
- g. The essay shall not exceed 1500 words.
 - 1.All words in the essay are counted including articles, conjunctives and pronouns. Examples: "I," "a," "the," "and" and "an." Provide word count on last page of essay.
 - 2. The essay must include a bibliography of alphabetized sources used in its composition.

Note: the bibliography is not included in the 1500 word count.

- 3. Essay should be typed in double space format
- h. All contest must be conducted in English
- i. Criteria for judging
 - 1. Sixty percent (60%) –based on the authenticity, current information and an application of the assigned essay topic
 - 2. Twenty five percent (25%) understandability of the essay through presentation techniques
 - 3. Fifteen percent (15%) grammar, spelling, sentence structure, pronunciation, enunciation, correct word usage and relationship to the assigned essay topic
- j. All judges should be knowledgeable of the subject

Awards:

- Certificate will be awarded to all participants. Scholarship award (TBD) will be given to 1st and 2nd place winners
- When there is only one applicant, no monetary award will be given, however applicant will be eligible to advance to the State level contest.
- To collect District scholarship award, the contestant winner must send a request to 2X1 Charities Inc. Treasurer via email with proof of registration information from the university/college or educational institution the contestant winner is enrolling along with any supplemental information needed by the institution.
- Contestant winner and/or runner-up must complete the Scholarship Request Form available on our District's website (https://lionsdistrict2x1.org/ forms/) along with proof of registration information from a university, college, junior college, or vocational school. The information should be sent along with any supplemental information needed by the institution (i.e., scholarship forms, etc).

- Scholarship award will be paid by 2X1 Charities Inc, directly to scholarship/financial aid/bursars office of the designated school.
- The scholarship award must be collected no later than two years following the recipients graduation from High school.

ONLINE CONTEST: Basic Guidelines

The following are some basic guidelines for the online contest. Prior to the Contest, Contestants and their Club sponsors will be provided with additional instruction for the online contests to be used by the LOFY Chair.

- . i. Contestants must have a computer or access to a computer with a wi-fi connection, video capability (webcam) and microphone to ensure that contestants' gestures and facial expressions will be captured by their camera and their voice will be clearly captured by the microphone while delivering their essay or speech.
 - ii. Contestants will be sent an email invitation by the Diabetes Awareness Essay Chair and/or LOFY Chair to participate in the contest and be ready at their designated time.
 - iii. Contestants must wear business attire for the online contest.
 - iv. Contestants' speaking area must be free of distractions, noise and if necessary, the LOFY Chair will advise contestants on additional lighting needs.
 - v. Contestants' speaking area should allow for maximum view of contestants without sacrificing audio quality while presenting his or her essay or speech.
 - vi. Once a contestant presents their essay or speech, he or she may be placed in a waiting room until the conclusion of the contest.
 - vii. After the conclusion of the contest and the results have been determined, all contestants will be readmitted to rejoin the online contest room, at which time the winners will be announced by the LOFY Contest chairs.
- viii First Place Winner may be asked to present his or her essay or speech in person at **District 2X1 Convention** on **Saturday, April 13**, **2024** and will advance to the state level contest
 - ix. All contestants will be recognized and receive a certificate of participation. In addition to scholarship awards, winning contestants will receive an award and a winner's certificate.
- x. If technology fails during the contest and the LOFY Contest Chair determines that the contest can no longer continue, the LOFY Contest Chair may pause the contest until the technology issue is resolved. A contestant may resume their speech or essay at the point at which the technology failed.
- xi If the 1st placed winner contestant is unable to participate in the MD-2 Contest, District 2-X1 LOFY Chair-with MD-2 State OFY Contest Chairman approval, will advance the 2nd Place winner to MD-2 Contest instead.
- xii Contestant who will advance to MD-2 State Contest (as stated in items ix and x above) will be contacted by MD-2 Contest Coordinator regarding detail information for:
 - Virtual Contest Orientation on Saturday, April 27, 2024.
 - Virtual MD-2 State OFY Contest on Saturday, May 4, 2024.
- xiii Contestant who win 1st Place at State Contest level must agree to attend MD-2 Opportunity for Youth Luncheon, Saturday, May 18, 2024 in Amarillo, TX and participate in Lions of Texas MD-2 events and activities during the period immediately after the contest until the end of the following year's contest. If this contestant is unable to attend, unless there is a medical or family emergency, the State Convention will forfeit their scholarship award. High school graduation or any school trip do not qualify as an emergency.

Striding for Healthy Living

MD-2 Lions of Texas invites you to participate on a virtual stride (walk, run, bike, dance, swim and etc,) at your own pace and place, in observance of the World Diabetes Day (Nov. 14th and November as World Diabetes Month

Due to the success of this event last 2 years, we are continuing the virtual "Striding for Healthy Living" Program.

Many of us have taken advantage of the COVID shutdowns to walk, run, bike, dance, swim etc, as a way to get out of the house and exercise, so we are encouraging Lions to exercise during the month and to keep track of the exercise/s of their choice. 

Membership retention is key, yet it's certainly one of the greatest challenges for most membership-based organizations like Lions Clubs. It begins at the forefront of your club's activities: focus on finding a target audience who will become long-term advocates for the club.

Many clubs in our District recruited new members during service activities. People who become Lions from these events joined because they liked what they saw and experienced. Some of our clubs recruited members after inviting them to attend regular Club Meetings, allowing them to feel the camaraderie and enjoy the fellowship members have for one another.

Engaging new members is essential to retaining them. Members who feel connected to the club are more likely to stay. Clubs should have a variety of activities and events that cater to different interests and ages. Asses members' interests, needs, and goals to know their expectations by conducting 'Members Satisfaction' or 'Feedback' survey. Educating new members about the different ways they can get 'value' from being a Lion can also be beneficial. This education may include networking, training, or volunteering sessions guided by more experienced members.

Communication is also an important key in retaining members. Monthly newsletters and personalized emails or cards (for any occasion) are not only effective as member retention strategies (keep members engaged), but also enhance your club's image. It is also beneficial to make personal calls to remind them of upcoming club meetings, if possible. Show new members that you care and that their presence is very important to the Club.

Finally, don't forget to recognize member(s) who have worked hard and volunteered every time they get a chance. Show your love and appreciation to what they've done to make your Club shine. A certificate of appreciation, a gift card to a grocery store or coffee shop, or even simply praising their work at club meetings would certainly be appreciated and continue to motivate them to keep serving and remain Lions Members. Retention, in the end, is a simple matter of educating, assessing, and engaging new members however you can in order to ensure they feel welcome, needed, and appreciated.

Focus on Childhood Cancer Every 2 minutes, a child is diagnosed with cancer

No child deserves cancer. Yet lymphomas, leukemias, and other forms of the disease common in children are the stark reality for many youth – and their families. There is both heartache and hope.

In the United States 1 in 285 children will be diagnosed with cancer before age 20. In 2020 there were 11,050 new cases of childhood cancer with a 90% cure rate. One in Ten will die from their disease. For the rest of the world cancer is the leading cause of death in children, with 300,000 new cases annually. In the lesser developed countries less than 20% survive.

"Your child has cancer" are four gut-wrenching words no parent ever wants to hear. In 2009 my wife and I learned that our daughter had thyroid cancer. We were fortunate that we had a network of people that had been through a similar experience and provided support as we navigated the treatment options. She has been cancer free for 14 years now.

More recently, my brother sent me a text that his wife's grand-nephew Mason (age 7) was losing his battle with brain cancer. After 8 months at St. Jude's, they were unable to do any more and were sending him home by air ambulance to be in hospice care. Three weeks ago, I received another text that little Mason had transitioned from life on earth to his forever home in heaven. Mason's legacy will be to remind all those that his short life touched to carry on the fight for a cure.

WHAT CAN WE DO? LCIF has invested more than \$2M in a partnership with Global Hope (a program of Texas Children's Hospital) to help improve cancer outcomes in developing countries. For our district, know that Childhood Cancer Grants, Matching Grants, and District & Club Community Impact (DCG) grants are available to assist with childhood cancer projects. From constructing recreation and patient-family rooms at a major hospital to passing out lion dolls to patients, there is a way for Lions to help.
