District 2-X1 is participating in Global Membership Approach to maximize our membership thereby maximizing our service to the community.

District 2-X1 Goals: Following are the district goals:

- Charter 2 new clubs
- Recruit 330 new members
- Drops to be below 280
- Net membership gain 50
- Serve 190,000 needy people in our community



How are we doing?

The current year 2023-2024 will end in another month. This is a good time to evaluate our district and clubs and remind ourselves of the SMART Goals we made at the beginning of the year. Have we achieved those goals, if not, what adjustments we have to make to accomplish those goals in a short time period. Overall, our district has surpassed all goals, individual clubs need to check their goals if they have achieved them.


Clubs: We have chartered four new clubs 'Dallas Denton Nepalese' Club with 20 members. Collin Athena Alliance (31 members) and Irving DFW Independent Campus (24 members), and Grand Prairie Host Family Clubs. Congratulations and welcome to the new club members and club sponsors.

2-X1 Membership Status: (May 30, 2024)

Added members	402
Dropped Members	246
Net Gain/Loss	156
Closing Balance	1.914

2-X1 goals for this year, is to recruit 330 new members with the drops limited to 280 for a net membership increase of 50. In the eleven months, we have surpassed that goal with +156. Let us keep the positive momentum going. The key to growth is member retention and 2-X1 has maintained a modest attrition of members. We have dropped 246 members and added 402. The chart shows 2-X1 goals vs actual. We have done extremely well in new clubs and member recruitment. District 2-X1 is leading in MD-2 with highest net growth and are competing for #1 spot in CA-1





The club's focus for the remainder of the month should be to look at their goals set in the beginning and devise an action plan for achieving those goals. Member Retention is the key to growth. Drops should be kept to a minimum, especially during the month of June. Non- attendance is not a criterion for dropping a member. Find innovative ways to help with dues payments. Embrace the 4- step GMA process. Please use this useful tool to better understand your club and how to recruit and retain new members. Several areas of improvement and member retention were identified with action plans. Zone Chairs will be discussing this with clubs during zone meetings. The District Goal setting meeting was held on April 27, and goals for next year have been set.

Service: In the period July – May, 495,405 people were served in 2570 service activities with 88,078 volunteer hours. 84% of the clubs have reported their activities on MyLion. District 2-X1 is leading in MD-2 with maximum number of people served in our communities. LCl goal is to serve over a Billion people and every service activity needs to be counted to help achieve that goal.

Leadership Training: Club officers training was already held in June, including Zone Chairs and LCIF. Over 80% zone chairs have attended the training. In addition, training is offered for Club President, Secretary and Treasurer. Approximately 60% of club officers have been trained. A trained Lion makes a better Lion. Training sessions for club officers and zone chairs was also held during MW Conference in January. Some training sessions were also offered during the District Convention.

LCIF Contributions: District 2-X1 has collected \$58,340 towards our foundation during the eleven months. Please donate generously so the foundation can help more people around the world.

GMA Round Table is held on last Tuesday of the month from 6-7 PM. The purpose of this is to educate and to make aware to the participants about the GMA process, have an open and engaging discussion and to get input from Lions across MD-2. Round Table was held April 30 with ID Marie Cunning from Arizona as Guest Speaker. The Round Table was held on May 28, 2024 with CCEEE Chris Gunstream as the Speaker.

Lions Opportunities for Youth Contests first place winners of the annual competition on Diabetes Awareness Essay Contest, Drug Speech Contest and Outstanding Youth Award delivered their winning essays at the state convention in Amarillo, TX, May 18, 2024. These contests allows the participants to apply for the Texas Lions Scholarships. The scholarship awards for these contests are \$3000 for the 1st place, \$2000 for the 2nd place and \$1000 for the 3rd place.

Outstanding Youth Award contest —Topic — "IMPACT OF CLIMATE CHANGE: A COMPLEX ISSUE" contestants are evaluated on high school GPA, a 750-word essay, a personal biographical information statement, three letters of recommendation, performance of community service, leadership experience/participation and a personal interview. Contestants were asked to write an essay about climate change impacts that are seen throughout every aspect of the world we live in. The essay should reflect on different environmental issues, what's causing these issues and what solutions are the experts recommending limiting the negative outcomes of climate change.

Diabetes Awareness Essay Contest – Topic: "**Knowing Diabetes is Fighting Diabetes**". Contestants were asked to define the various types of diabetes, symptoms and health issues related to diabetes, as well as identifying medical treatments, provide information about healthy meals and lifestyle changes helpful to people with diabetes.

Drug Speech Contest – Topic: "AN OLDIE YET NEW DRUG IN TOWN: XYLANE". Contestants were asked to write about the drug, how it is prepared, the side effects and prolonged effects once it is ingested and to include treatments and solutions to prevents peers from using this drug

District's 2024 LOFY Contestant Won Two Contests at State's Level

Leo Vinay Upadhyay, a Senior at Sunnyvale ISD High School, won 1st Place for the Outstanding Youth Award and 2nd Place for the Diabetes Awareness Essay Contest at the MD-2 LOFY Contest judging on Saturday, May 4, 2024. Leo Vinay presented his winning Outstanding Youth Award essay, "Climate Change: A Complex Issue," and received the award certificate and scholarship (\$3,000 and \$2,000 respectively) at the Opportunity for Youth Luncheon on Saturday, May 18, 2024 at noon at the MD-2 State Convention in Amarillo, TX.

This year, a total of 30 junior and senior high school students from 12 districts in the MD-2 Texas competed at the LOFY State levels. Eleven students competed in the Diabetes Awareness Essay, nine in the Drug Awareness Speech, and 10 for the Outstanding Youth Award.

At District level this year, Leo Vinay won 1st Place in the Diabetes Awareness Essay contest and was the only contestant who automatically advanced to the State's LOFY contests in both the Drug Awareness Speech and the Outstanding Youth Award. Leo Vinay plans to attend UT Austin this Fall, majoring in Accounting/Business Administration. He was sponsored by the Dallas Everest Lions Club.
