#### Membership Status:

We are proud to report that we have chartered 3 new Lions Clubs and submitted approval for our 4th Club, **Dallas Everest Women's Lions Club**, sponsored by Dallas Everest. We've also chartered 3 Leo Clubs and 2 Cub Clubs, bringing us to a net positive of 165 members till now. This is a great achievement, and I thank all of you for your efforts.

However, some clubs are facing challenges in recruiting new members, while others have experienced a decline. **Retention and engagement remain crucial to our ongoing success.** I encourage all clubs to reach out to prospective members and invite them to join the clubs.

#### **Service Activities:**

Thank you to all clubs actively participating in service initiatives. Whether it's local community support or global causes, your contributions are making a difference. However, some clubs are still lagging in reporting:

- 40 clubs are actively reporting, 27 clubs (including Leo Clubs) report occasionally, and 6 Lions Clubs, along with most of the Leo Clubs, have not reported any activities yet.
- Our overall reporting stands at 77%, including Leo Clubs. I strongly encourage all clubs to consistently report their service activities to help showcase the full scope of our impact.



**Moving forward** for the year we need to manage member drops. Several members have left in good standing. Clubs need to develop a retention strategy to minimize member drops. 2-X1 has 10 clubs with <10 members. These clubs need to be rejuvenated.

2-XI has to clubs with \$10 members. These clubs need to be rejuvenal

33 clubs with no membership activity through September.

**Service**: In the last four months 2-X1 Lions have served over 208,224 people with 919 service activities dedicating 33,118 volunteer hours. 77% of the clubs have reported their activities on Lions Portal. District 2-X1 is leading in MD-2 with maximum number of people served in our communities. LCI goal is to serve over a Billion people and every service activity needs to be counted to help achieve that goal.

**Leadership Training:** Club officers training was already held in June, including Zone Chairs. Club Officers training for Club President, Secretary and Treasurer was offered in June. Another club officers training will be offered in November.

**LCIF Contributions:** District 2-X1 has collected \$4,671 towards our foundation during this fiscal year. Better club participation is needed to meet our goal.



#### Helo District 2-X1 Clubs

One of our District 2-X1 goals, established by District Governor Radha and the District 2-X1 Leadership Team, is the percentage of Lions Club Officers who will take advantage of opportunities to improve their skill level through training. The goal for percentage of Club Presidents, Club Secretaries, and Club Treasurers has been set at 65%.

As of today, 54.4% of Club Presidents, 49.25% of Club Secretaries, and 45.45% of Club Treasurers have taken advantage of one of the previous training opportunities for this Lion year.

Clubs run smoother and have fewer issues if their officers know what they should be doing. That is covered by training offered by the District Global Leadership team. Most of the individual club "problems" and "issues" can be attributed to a lack of officer training or not asking district leadership members for help or guidance.

In November, the Global Leadership Team offer Zoom-based training opportunities for these three officer positions. November 2<sup>nd</sup> will be Treasurer training, November 9<sup>th</sup> will be Secretary training, and November 16<sup>th</sup> will be President training. Each session will run from 9:00 am to noon. An email has been sent to each of these officers who have yet to receive training for this year. It includes the Zoom link to the training.

If your club President, Secretary, and/or Treasurer has not received training for this Lion year, ask them to take advantage of this opportunity. Failure of any of these officers to receive training eliminates your club from receiving LCI's Club Excellence Award for this Lion Year.

Club Excellence is the essence of what <u>every</u> Lions Club should be doing to support their community. Our Motto "We Serve" means that we serve others. And each requirement listed on the Club Excellence Award Application helps clubs be better prepared to accomplish and increase their service.

## Eye Clinic for El Centro College Students: A Two-Day Collaborative Project between two Lions Clubs and S2S

allas Founder Lions Club, Collin Athena Alliance Lions Club (CAALC) and El Centro College's employees and students base organization, Sister-to-Sister (S2S) collaborated to provide a free eye clinic for ECC students and staff on Monday and Tuesday, Oct. 14 and 15, 2024 from 9 AM to 12 PM at the ECC downtown campus's main entrance rotunda at 801 Main Street, Dallas, TX 75202. Capped at 50 people being screened, a grand total of 42 were prescribed eyeglasses by Dr. Toni Schutte. They will receive their new eyeglasses at this location within 2-3 weeks.

This program was made possible partly by the Dallas Founder's and CAALC charities fund which paid for the bus and doctor for the two-day services, and the S2S program, which funded the eyeglasses themselves. The debut of the program went very well and we hope to offer it again in the future.

Special thanks to all of our volunteers from Dallas Founder (Lions Maggie Lopez, Matthew Williams, Rollin Gary, Ani MacKay, Carol Donovan, Jeff Stratter, Jean Ball, Cheri Ball-Meza, PDG Keith Murray, PDG Darla Wisdom, Vitaly Lunev, Tatyana Bringle, and Nia MacKay) and from CAALC (Lions Alina Kamacharya and Kanchan Busnet), as well as Lion Maggie's assistants (Blanca Rodriguez and Crystal Huerta) who staffed the program on either or both days. We commended Lion Rollin Gary (Dallas Founer LC), for successfully drive the Neil Roach Mobile Eye Clinic from Waxahachie to downtown Dallas (and back) for the first time, and served as refractometer operator in the bus after being trained by Lion Carol.


