I hope you enjoyed the holidays with your loved ones as we said goodbye to 2024—a year filled with service, achievements, and cherished memories. As we reflect on the past year, we also honor and remember the Lions and their families we lost in 2024. Their contributions to our communities and the Lions organization will never be forgotten.

As we step into 2025, let's embrace it with renewed energy and commitment. I'm incredibly proud of the progress we've made in District 2-X1 in last six months, thanks to our teamwork and dedication. Your commitment has truly made a difference in the lives of those we serve, and I thank you all for your continued efforts.

Lions are more than just a service organization—we are a family. Let's continue to strengthen that bond and make 2025 an even more successful year together.

Revised Goal for Membership and New Clubs:

Due to our ongoing commitment with MD2 and CA-1 Area meetings, we have revised our District Goals for membership, service, and other key areas. We now aim to establish at least 5 new clubs and surpass our previous membership target. I request all club leaders and the cabinet team to fully support Mission 1.5, and Lions Clubs International's target as we strive to recruit new and diversified members to strengthen and grow our district. Together, we can achieve greater success and make a lasting impact in our communities.

Membership Update:

- We have welcomed 366 new members, including 5 new Lions clubs and 3 new Leo
 Clubs. After accounting for 179 drops, we've achieved a net growth of 187 members.
- 31 clubs have shown positive net growth, 20 clubs have no membership growth, and 13 clubs are experiencing negative net growth.
- Let's engage, retain, and invite new members, ensuring no one feels left behind. By
 working together, we will continue to "Make Our Mark" in our communities and
 beyond.

Congratulations and Welcome to the New Club:

Dallas Everest Lions Club has sponsored its third club for this year, the Dallas
 Himalayan Women's Lions Club, officially approved by LCI on December 29th, 2024.
 Congratulations to Charter President Ganga Baral and all the Lions members of the new club!

Retention:

To ensure sustainable growth, club leaders and the cabinet team must prioritize member retention. This includes addressing the needs and interests of existing members to keep them engaged. Retention strategies, such as offering leadership development opportunities and fostering a sense of community, are essential. Supporting new clubs in targeted areas will help strengthen our presence in key communities.

Service and Reporting:

- Our service efforts have impacted **339,000 people**, with **1,437 service activities** and **53,500 volunteer hours** logged.
- Service reporting is at 95% (including Leo Clubs), and nearly 98.5% of Lions clubs have reported their activities. Let's continue reporting regularly to track the full impact of our district's work. Congratulations to all!

Training and Leadership:

- New members and club officers will have opportunities to receive training at the Mid-Winter Conference on January 18th, 2025. Please register for the event and reserve your spot.
- For those who missed the **Zone Chairs and Officers' Training**, stay updated through the district website and notices from our GLT Coordinator.

LCIF Contributions:

We are currently behind our goal of raising \$60,000 for LCIF, with \$16,092 raised so far, supported by 21 clubs and 14 individual Lions. I encourage all clubs and individuals to contribute generously to support LCIF for the global humanitarian projects., and fulfill one of your club excellence criteria.

Membership Dues and Supporting Charities:

As we begin the new year, I urge all clubs to settle any **outstanding invoices** as soon as possible. Timely payment of **LCI and District dues** is essential to keeping our operations running smoothly. In **January**, new invoices will be issued, and I encourage you to promptly settle both previous and new dues. Your support is critical for the continued success of your club, district, and our service to the communities we serve.

A heartfelt thank you to everyone who supported our December events! Your dedication made a real impact—from building beds for children to joining the holiday parades and celebrating at the District Christmas Potluck Party. Let's keep the momentum going into the new year!

2-X1 goals for this year was to recruit 300 new members with the drops limited to 240 for a net membership increase of +60. We have already exceeded in net members to 212. The chart shows the drops have been contained. Our net increase is 212 exceeding the goal of 60. Recommend we readjust our membership goal to reflect our current positive trend from 60 to 230. We have done extremely well in new clubs and member recruitment. Congratulations to District 2-X1 for leading in MD-2 with the highest net growth and in CA-1. Following are top five clubs for net membership growth % (Nov 30, 2024)



Moving forward 2-X1 dropped 53 members in the month of December. We have offset that by adding 56 new members. We still need to contain the drops, especially in December and June. The clubs need







to have a clear strategy and criteria, if faced with dropping a member. Extended periods of non-payment of dues and non-participation in service projects should be the determining factor to drop a member. Several members have left in good standing. Getting in touch with them and addressing any issue would help. 2-X1 has 10 clubs with <10 members. These clubs need help to be rejuvenated. 26 clubs with no membership activity through November need to consider holding membership events.

Service: In the last six months 2-X1 Lions have served over 339,276 people with 1,437 service activities dedicating 53,553 volunteer hours. 95% of the clubs have reported their activities on Lions Portal. District 2-X1 is leading in MD-2 with maximum number of people served in our communities. LCl goal is to serve over a Billion people and every service activity needs to be counted to help achieve that goal.

Leadership Training: Club Officers training for Zone Chairs, Club President, Secretary and Treasurer was offered in June. Club officers training was offered in November. Training will also be offered in Mid-Winter Conference in January. 67% Club Presidents, 61% Secretary and 50% Treasurers have been trained.

LCIF Contributions: District 2-X1 has collected \$16,092 towards our foundation during this fiscal year. Better club participation is needed to meet our goal.



I hope that you have, or soon will, register to attend our District 2-X1 Mid-Winter Conference followed by the 3rd District Cabinet Meeting. Lunch will be provided by Jason's Deli for a \$10 fee if you are staying for the cabinet meeting or wish to join us for lunch.

DG Radha has a great conference schedule with informational breakouts. All Lions are encouraged to attend.

Here we are in 2025! Half of the Lion year has already passed. There are things that clubs should prepare to do as we start the steady march to the 2025-2026 Lion Year. I will be listing the steps clubs need to take in preparation for the year end. One will be that Club Presidents should be thinking of appointing a nominations committee of which they should also participate. Identifying and encouraging club members to step up into new leadership roles is a large part of what Lionism is about. Growing membership is important to maintain your club's service. But growing new and well trained leaders is what keeps our Association of Clubs alive.

The "District 2-X1 Lions University" for the upcoming Lion year is scheduled for June 21, 2025. Details will be forthcoming but save the date and plan to get your club's incoming officers there for in-person training.

One of our 2024-2025 district goals is for 65% of Club Presidents, Club Secretaries, and Club Treasurers to have received training. As of today, of our 68 clubs, 67.65% of Club Presidents, 55.88% of Club Secretaries, and 50.0% of Club Treasurers have taken advantage of one of the training opportunities for this Lion year. Clubs run smoother and have fewer issues if their officers know what they should be doing. 
You may not have had an overwhelming experience in your service, or you may not have received "heart strings" while serving, but I ask you to put yourself in the shoes of those who received your help. To them, you were a blessing; you changed their lives. That should be a "heart string" feeling enough for you to know you made a difference. I have both experienced the feeling by seeing the results and by anticipating the impact I may have had on someone's life.

For example, having the privilege of being on the Executive Board of Texas Lions Camp, including being President and Chairman of the Board, I have been both behind the scenes creating programs and opportunities for children with physical disabilities and directly involved with them in their activities at Camp. I have seen what I call miracles happen from children attending TLC than I can count. This just inspires me more to help the Camp any way that I can.

Another example is "Build Beds for Kids," our District service project. How many of you feel a sense of pride and accomplishment after you have participated as a Lion volunteer in building the parts for a bed you know is going to be eventually placed in a home for a child that did not have a bed to sleep in. How about the 150+ beds we made and took to TLC for children who attend Camp to sleep in? Hopefully, some of you have been able to extend your "heart string" feeling by being involved in delivering the bed parts and assembling them in a child's home with representatives of Sleep in Heavenly Peace and seeing the expression on their faces when they first sat on their new bed. Is that enough feeling for you to want to do more?

Membership in Lions is more than just belonging to an organization, paying a nominal amount of dues, and receiving a membership certificate. More importantly, it is a way of life, a life of service to others. I am reminded of the recent passing of President Jimmy Carter, a Lion from Plains, Georgia. He must have learned by being a Lion that serving others and asking nothing in return is

the greatest gift anyone can give. I quote him: "Lions changed my life." His legacy of service to others? A peanut farmer, a Lion in his community, and a life of giving back as Governor of Georgia, President of the United States, and most of all...a life of building homes through Habitat for Humanity's for people needing a home almost to his last years before reaching 100 years of age. A wonderful example of a life full of service for all of us!

TO SHOW my faith in the worthiness of my vocation by industrious application to the end that I may merit a reputation for quality of service.

TO SEEK success and demand all fair remuneration or profit as my just due, but to accept no profit or success at the price of my own self-respect lost because of unfair advantage taken or because of questionable acts on my part.

TO REMEMBER that in building up my business it is not necessary to tear down another's; to be loyal to my clients or customers and true to myself.

WHENEVER a doubt arises as to the right or ethics of my position or action towards others, to resolve such doubt against myself.

TO HOLD friendship as an end and not a means. To hold that true friendship exists not on account of the service performed by one to another, but that true friendship demands nothing but accepts service in the spirit in which it is given.

ALWAYS to bear in mind my obligations as a citizen to my nation, my state and my community, and to give them my unswerving loyalty in word, act and deed. To give them freely of my time, labor and means.

TO AID others by giving my sympathy to those in distress, my aid to the weak, my substance to the needy

TO BE CAREFUL with my criticism and liberal with my praise, to build up and not destroy.
