As we reflect on the remarkable Mid-Winter Conference and 3rd Cabinet Meeting held on January 18, 2025, I express my heartfelt gratitude to all participants and volunteers. With over 200 Lions in attendance, the event was a great success thanks to the **Richardson Host Lions Club**, FVDG Kedar Timalsina, PDG Fred Conger, and the entire team. Special recognition goes to **Council Chair Terrell Thompson** for his inspiring speech on the **power of Lions to impact communities.**

Congratulations to all award recipients for your dedication and contributions to your clubs and our district. Your hard work exemplifies the spirit of service that drives us forward.

Membership Growth and Retention:

We've welcomed 411 new members, including 5 new Lions clubs, 3 Leo clubs, and 3 Cub clubs, achieving a net growth of 214 members after accounting for 197 drops. However, 18 clubs are experiencing negative growth. Membership retention is key—let's engage and support our current members while inviting new ones. For clubs with negative or no growth, there's still time to turn things around! By focusing on meaningful engagement, you can ensure no one misses out on the opportunity to achieve Club Excellence. Together, by establishing new clubs and recruiting new members, we want to maintain this momentum at the highest level to meet our membership goals under Mission 1.5.

If your club needs any support with membership efforts, feel free to reach out to our cabinet team—we are here to help you succeed.

Service and Reporting:

Our district's service activities have impacted 401,207 people, with 1,849 service projects and 71,077 volunteer hours logged so far. Service reporting stands at 97% with Leo Clubs included, and 100% of Lions Clubs have submitted their reports. Let's keep up the great work and continue reporting regularly to showcase the full impact of our efforts. Congratulations to all for your hard work!

Training and Leadership:

Many club officers and new members took part in training at the Mid-Winter Conference, moving us closer to achieving our training goals. Remember, trained Lions are better Lions—complete your training to qualify for the Club Excellence Award.

LCIF Contributions:

I encourage all clubs and members to contribute generously to support LCIF's global humanitarian efforts and fulfill one of the Club Excellence criteria.

We've raised \$22,432 toward our goal of \$60,000 for LCIF, supported by 25 clubs and 32 individual Lions.







Moving forward 2-X1 is on track to accomplish the new revised goals. We still have to contain the drops. The clubs need to have a clear strategy and criteria, if faced with dropping a member. Extended

periods of non- payment of dues and non-participation in service projects should be the determining factor to drop a member. Several members have left in good standing. Getting in touch with them and addressing any issue would help. 2-X1 has 10 clubs with <10 members. These clubs need help to be rejuvenated.

26 clubs with no membership activity through December need to consider holding membership events.


Service: In the last seven months 2-X1 Lions have served over 401,207 people with 1,849 service activities dedicating 71,077 volunteer hours. 97% of the clubs have reported their activities on Lions Portal. District 2-X1 is leading in MD-2 with maximum number of people served in our communities. LCI goal is to serve over a Billion people and every service activity needs to be counted to help achieve that goal.

Leadership Training: Club Officers training for Zone Chairs, Club President, Secretary and Treasurer was offered in June. Club officers training was offered in November. Training was also offered in Mid-Winter Conference in January including New Member Orientation. 67% Club Presidents, 61% Secretary and 50% Treasurers have been trained.

LCIF Contributions: District 2-X1 has collected \$22,432 towards our foundation during this fiscal year. Better club participation is needed to meet our goal.

Clubs run smoother and have fewer issues if their officers know what they should be doing.


