As we move into the month of March, I am filled with pride and gratitude for all that we have accomplished together. Your dedication to service and your commitment to our communities have been nothing short of inspiring. Let's continue building on the momentum we've achieved as we work toward our goals for the remainder of the Lion year.

We had a wonderful Third Council of Governors' meeting in Kerrville, Texas, on February 6-8, 2025. Now, we are looking forward to our **District Convention on April 25-26, 2025**, with our Keynote Speaker, International Director Robert "Ski" Marcinkowski, and his spouse, Lion Jenis, from Alaska. Our Convention Chairs, PCC Joe Montag and PDG Bill Smothermon, have already announced all program details, which are posted on our district website. Please register early to secure your spot, and encourage your members to do the same.

On March 22, 2025, we will be hosting the **Build Beds for Kids Project** in Waxahachie. Details are available on the website, and you can reach out to PCC John Landrum and PCC John Eads for donations and other information. Be sure to register online if you'd like to volunteer.

Another exciting event is the **joint charter ceremony** for four new clubs, scheduled for **March 23, 2025**, at the Hilton Garden Inn, Valley View Lane, Irving. Our Keynote Speaker will be International 2nd Vice President Mark S. Lyon from Connecticut, USA, and PID Ernesto "TJ" Tejerina will also be joining us. Please mark your calendars for this special occasion.

I am proud to announce that our district has secured one of the top positions in membership growth within Constitutional Area 1. I request all of you to help us take the lead through June 30, 2025, and beyond. This is our opportunity to create a historic legacy for District 2-X1 by becoming the Number 1 District in the area. A huge thank you to all the clubs and the district team for your collective efforts in achieving this success. Let's "Make Our Mark"!

Membership Growth and Retention:

We are facing a recurring issue of retention in some clubs. Out of 69 clubs, 19 are currently experiencing negative growth, 15 have a zero-growth rate, and 15 have less than a net plus of 3 members.

Membership retention is crucial to reversing this trend. Let's focus on engaging and supporting our current members while continuing to invite new ones. Clubs with negative or no growth still have time to turn things around! By emphasizing meaningful engagement and active participation, every club has the opportunity to achieve the Five Star Club Excellence Award or the Club Excellence Award by June 2025. Together, by establishing new clubs and recruiting new members, we can maintain our momentum and meet our membership goals under Mission 1.5.

While we've successfully welcomed 452 new members, achieving a net growth of 233 members after accounting for 219 drops, the main reasons for drops include resignations (53), non-attendance (17), relocations (34), member transfers (22), other personal reasons (24), non-payment (36), and deaths (9). We must address these causes by focusing on engagement and retention efforts, except for unavoidable cases such as death and transfers.

If your club needs any support with membership efforts, don't hesitate to reach out to our Membership Team—we are here to help you succeed!

Service and Reporting:

Our district's service activities have impacted 466105 people, with 2109 service projects and 78008 volunteer hours logged so far. Service reporting stands at 93% with Leo Clubs included due to 6 inactive Leo Clubs, however, 100% of Lions Clubs have submitted their reports. Let's keep up the great work and continue reporting regularly to showcase the full impact of our efforts. Congratulations to all for your hard work!

Training and Leadership:

Thank you to everyone who participated in the officers' and new members' training sessions during this period. For those who were unable to attend, please complete your training online and report to the GLT Coordinator to qualify for the Club Excellence Award. Let's continue working together to ensure that our officers and members are equipped with the training they need to lead their clubs effectively and serve their communities with confidence.

Additionally, it is time to submit nomination letters for district office positions to the District Election Chairs, as required by our bylaws, before the 4th Cabinet Meeting. Please reach out to the Election Chairs for further guidance.

LCIF Contributions:

I encourage all clubs and members to contribute generously to support LCIF's global humanitarian efforts and fulfill one of the Club Excellence criteria. We've raised \$43,676 toward our goal of \$60,000 for LCIF, supported by 29 clubs and 43 individual Lions. Let's

continue working toward this goal and make a significant impact through our collective efforts and contact to District LCIF Chair Manuel Palavicini.

Membership Dues:

The **second half (Final) invoices** have already been issued by both the district and Lions Clubs International. Please ensure your club pays the district and LCI dues to maintain **good standing**. Being in good standing is essential for participating in district activities and for recognition by **Lions Clubs International**.


2-X1 revised goals for this year is to recruit 411 new members with the drops limited to 181 for a net membership increase of 230.

Contain the drops. The clubs need to have a clear strategy and criteria, if faced with dropping a member. Extended periods of non- payment of dues and non-participation in service projects should be the determining factor to drop a member. Several members have left in good standing. Getting in touch with them and addressing any issue would help. 2-X1 has 10 clubs with <10 members. These clubs need help to be rejuvenated. A membership committee meeting was held to increase net membership in the next four months to become 1st in CA-1. Suggest all 11 zones bringing in net 2 members in each zone. Also, retention is the key for growth. 18 clubs with no membership activity through December need to consider holding membership events and increase by one net member.


Service: In the last eight months 2-X1 Lions have served over 464,964 people with 2076 service activities dedicating 77,813 volunteer hours. 97% of the clubs have reported their activities on Lions Portal. LCI goal is to serve over a Billion people and every service activity needs to be counted to help achieve that goal.

Leadership Training: Club Officers training for Zone Chairs, Club President, Secretary and Treasurer was offered in June. Club officers training was offered in November. Training was also offered in Mid-Winter Conference in January including New Member Orientation. 67% Club Presidents, 61% Secretary and 50% Treasurers have been trained.

LCIF Contributions: District 2-X1 has collected \$43,676 towards our foundation during this fiscal year. Better club participation is needed to meet our goal.

Mobile Medical Care Unit (MMCU) in DFW District 2x-1: Promoting Health and Preventing Disease

Access to healthcare remains a significant challenge for many uninsured and underserved populations in the DFW area, especially in District 2x-1. Many individuals in these communities face barriers to care, leading to untreated chronic conditions and preventable health complications. Our mobile medical unit is committed to bridging this gap by providing accessible healthcare directly to these populations.

Our mobile medical unit is driven by the motto: Health Promotion, Disease Prevention. By detecting illnesses in their early stages, we can help improve health outcomes, reduce the risk of severe complications, and ultimately save lives. A cornerstone of our mobile medical unit's work is to provide routine health fairs, where free screenings for chronic conditions such as diabetes, hypertension, high cholesterol, and anemia are offered. Timely detection is critical, as conditions like these are leading causes of death. According to the CDC, heart disease, diabetes, and stroke—often linked to these conditions—are among the top ten leading causes of death in the U.S. Early detection through screenings can prevent these diseases from progressing into more serious and complex complications.

At each health fair, attendees receive consultations with medical providers, who can prescribe medications on-site for immediate treatment of acute health issues and others are guided to follow up with free clinics in DFW. This proactive approach reduces the burden on emergency services and ensures that individuals receive the care they need without delay. The success of our health fairs is made possible through the collaboration of local organizations, including Lions Clubs and dedicated volunteers. Their support helps ensure that each event is smoothly executed, reaching as many individuals as possible.
