Summary:

- 1. Membership Growth: Zone 1, 2, and 3 have positive net, with Zone 3 recruited the most (16 new members). Zone 3 has the highest drop (-6), while Zone 4 has the highest number of net growth (+16 new members). This results showed that East Region has +10 net membership growth in the last 3 months. Plan of action: To keep this positive growth going. We need to assess Zone 3 and help them to recover the by enhancing their retention efforts. Recommendation: Attending the Membership Roundtable Summit could be a great way to boost their member recruitment rate. Also, keeping members engaged and making a personal contact can improve retention.
- **2. Service Reporting:** A total of 101 service activities were reported (down over 25% of the previous report-139) and 76,864 people being served (45% less than last year-139,034). Zone 3 has the highest number of reporting clubs (5 out of 6 clubs); Zone 1 has the highest number of reported service activities (44) and Zone 4 has the highest number of people served (69,4K). From 21 clubs in the East Region, 10 clubs (47%) reported their service activities, down 7% from the last quarter. Unfortunately, there are several clubs who failed to report their service activities, some of them did not report their service for over 6 month. **Plan of action:** Need a dedicated and committed President, Secretary or the Service Activity Chair who understand the importance of service reporting for their clubs, District, and LCI.
- **3.** *LCIF Donation*: East Region clubs has doubled the amount of donation from last year report (\$3,991 vs \$1,802). Report indicated that 11 from total of 21 clubs (54%) have made a donation to LCIF. Zone 1, 3 and 4 have the same number of clubs (3) who donated to LCIF. Zone 2 has the highest donation amount (\$2,012), with the highest donation came from the Commerce Lions Club (\$2,000). *Plan of Action*:
 - a. DG visit: share success stories on how and what LCIF has done to our district.
 - b. Donor recognition program announced at Cabinet Meeting
 - c. Special appreciation events for donators.
- 4. No report from Zone Chair received at the time of this report is written.

In conclusion, East Region clubs have done a great job in recruiting members since the last report; however, they need stronger efforts in retaining their members. On the service activities, the 25% decrease in the number of services reported has dramatically affected the number of people served to almost 50% less than last quarter. I trust that the reduction in reporting time (from January 9 to March 9, 2025, spanning only two months) will not adversely impact the analysis. Conversely, the LCIF donation has surged by a remarkable 221% since the previous report. This substantial increase underscores the resounding success of the LCIF donation campaign.

If we can maintain this positive results, I am confident that the clubs in the East Region will achieve a better outcome by the conclusion of the 2024-2025 Lions Year.
