



Lion Kedar’s journey in Lionism began in his home country of Nepal, where he joined the Himalayan Patan Leo Club in 1997. His early leadership was evident, serving as Leo Club President from 2001 to 2002, and then as Leo District Council President from 2002 to 2003. He continued to guide and inspire the Leo movement as an advisor for several years.

After moving to the United States, Lion Kedar became a member of the Dallas Everest Lions Club in 2016. Since then, he has served in nearly every major leadership role in the club, including Treasurer, Secretary, Vice President, and President in the 2021–2022 Lions year—during which the club was recognized with the Club Excellence Award.

At the district level, Lion Kedar has contributed extensively, serving as Lion Tamer for four years and Zone Chair for two consecutive terms. In 2023–2024, he proudly represented District 2-X1 as First and Second Vice District Governor, attending Council of Governors meetings and supporting clubs across the district. Lion Kedar is deeply committed to leadership development. He earned a Master’s Degree from Lions University at the 2023 USA/Canada Forum and has participated in multiple leadership training through District 2-X1 and MD2. He has attended more than five International Lions Conventions, with the most recent being in Melbourne, Australia in 2024. His service has been recognized with many prestigious honors. He is a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow, and a Life Member of the Texas Lions Camp, Texas Lions Museum, and Lions Sight and Tissue Foundation. He received Certificates of Appreciation from the International President in both 2021 and 2022, and was awarded the International Leadership Award in 2022 one of the highest recognitions in the Lions organization. In addition, he was named District Grassroots Lion and Lion of the Year in 2018–2019, and received the 100% Club President Award for his exceptional leadership in 2021–2022.

Behind his dedication stands a supportive family. Lion Kedar has been married to Lion Indira Timalsina for 22 years, and together they have a daughter, Leo-Lion Kritika Timalsina. As a family, they have shared over two decades of active service and commitment to the values of Lionism.
