Lions District 2-X1 will host its District Convention on April 24–25, 2026, at the Hilton Garden Inn Dallas/Duncanville, under the theme *"Inclusion in Leadership, Unity in Service."* As the largest year-end event of the Lionistic year, the convention is a celebration of service, leadership, and fellowship, and a pivotal moment to reflect on achievements while charting the path forward.

The District Convention brings Lions together to review annual accomplishments, participate in district decision-making, and share best practices that strengthen clubs. It is also the formal stage for evaluation and recognition, honoring outstanding service through awards such as Lion of the Year, Club of the Year, and other district recognitions. Attendees will benefit from breakout sessions covering LCIF, TLC, the Lions Museum, JC Hyer, and District 2-X1 charities, along with exhibitor booths and engaging activities, including the popular Saturday Cookie Contest.

This is a mandatory registration event, and all participants must register in advance.

This once-a-year gathering offers a unique opportunity to meet and greet a history-making special guest, connect with fellow Lions and Leos, and network with thousands of Lions, Leos, and attending family members. District 2-X1 proudly represents a growing family of over 2,300 Lions and nearly 400 Leos, making the convention a true celebration of unity and inclusion.

This convention carries special importance as District 2-X1 will vote and nominate Past Council Chair John Landrum for Lions Clubs International International Director. Club delegates are encouraged to attend and vote, ensuring the district's voice is heard at the international level.

This is a mandatory registration event, and all participants must register in advance. Early registration closes March 31, 2026, with late registration ending April 13, 2026. Let us participate, meet and greet, get energized, and make our District 2-X1 Convention a grand success an opportunity that comes only once each year.

Hello Lion Family!!

HAPPY NEW YEAR!!! I Hope you enjoyed ringing in 2026! What a big year this will be celebrating the United States of America's 250th Anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. That decision by our forefathers forever shaped the future for all of us. To have the freedoms we celebrate everyday as Americans.

Freedom also means choices! We have the free will to live where we want, to work and enjoy our lives. Part of that freedom also allows us to use our time to help others by volunteering. This has been something I have done for most of my life. So today, I want to share my story on becoming a Lion and why I made the decision to move into leadership.

I have known about the Lions for a long time. I live in a small suburban town called Midlothian. Every year the Lions host a pancake breakfast for the community. At the time, I thought it was club for retired people like the Shriners. I didn't think I would be a good fit as a younger, active, full time working guy with a family.

From there, my name became better known throughout the city. Now, I have lived here most of my life, so I was a hometown boy but not recognized as a community leader. WHY is this important? This is when I had my first interaction with a Lion. I met Kevin at an after-hours social for the Chamber. We were talking and he asked if I knew about the Lions. I said yes but really knew nothing about them. He invited me to a meeting but at the time I just wasn't ready to take on another "commitment" I was content with what I was doing at the time with the city and family.

Kevin invited me several times when we would see each other. Then one day, he caught me at the perfect time. My wife and family were out of town, and I had nothing going on so I agreed to attend. My life CHANGED that day! When I walk in, I see my old track coach and a few friends I have known for DECADES! It was so good to see them and visit. It was a small group of about 10 or so but I knew most of them and had NO IDEA they were Lions.

I have always been one to help where help is needed and I could see they needed help, so I joined that night. 18 mos. later, I am club President. I had sponsored a few new members, brought new ideas and leadership. I served 3 years as president and doubled our membership. We were more active and seen in the community with a presence. We increased scholarships for school students and attended Chamber functions with a booth. Each time, we gained a new member.

That's when the DG Cabinet took a notice in me and my journey toward becoming a District Governor began. I hope my story inspires you to know that YOU TOO can make an impact in your club! It just takes a decision and action!

The most important thing I learned during this process was AWARENESS! Most communities have no idea what Lions do or what they offer. If you want your club to grow, GET OUT THERE AND BE A LION! SERVE YOUR COMMUNITY!

With gratitude for all you do and optimism for the year ahead, let us continue to serve with purpose and pride.




United In Service

GLOBAL MEMBERSHIP APPROACH GMA

District 2-X1, December 31, 2025

Lead to Serve and Serve to Lead: This is the theme our current International President AP Singh is committed to expanding our service to grow our membership. This philosophy is rooted in the idea that service and leadership are inextricably linked, each strengthening the other. This dynamic relationship is best captured by the dual principles of "Lead to Serve and Serve to Lead".



District 2-X1 had a good start this year, having chartered two clubs but we took a big hit on member drops in December with a negative growth. I believe we will accomplish our goal in the second half.

2-X1 Goals for year 2025-2026.

- Charter New Clubs....2
- Add New Members...364
- Maximum Drops.....306
- Net New Members....58

Service Goals:

Since we have set the bar high in service from last year, our goal this year is to serve 500,000 people and at least 80% reporting their service activities.

LCIF: Raise \$65,000 for our foundation.

Leadership: All Zone Chairs to undergo training.

2-X1 Membership Status: (November 30, 2025)

2-X1 has lost 88 members in December with a net Of -65. See chart. We are seeking a net growth of +123 in the second half to accomplish our goal of +58. It is achievable if we keep our drops to a minimum.

Clubs. 2-X1 has chartered 2 new clubs during the first month.

Need to charter one more club to replace the cancelled Allen Club.

Service: Lions within the district collectively served **over 356,513**

people in six months. There were 1317 service activities and 52,574 volunteer hours contributed. Over 60% of clubs have reported on their activities.

Leadership Training: Club Officers training for Zone Chairs, Club President, Secretary and Treasurer was offered in June. Another training session was offered during cabinet meeting.

LCIF Contributions: District 2-X1 has received \$38,529 towards our foundation during this fiscal year.

The month of December has witnessed a free fall of our members. 2-X1 has dropped 93 members during the month of December. Major drops came from Dallas Ace 22, UTD Infinity 13, Irving Noon Day 13, Allen 8 and others. Club Presidents are reminded to use all resources to keep the members and not wait till the last day to drop so many members. This is a reminder to all club President's to use the GMA process, have your club goals by now and implementing it with a plan of action. Complete your SWOT analysis to identify your strengths and areas that need improvement. It is critical to understand why we are losing members in good standing. If you need assistance please contact me, I will be glad to give a presentation on the GMA process.

Members Drop Analysis

The 2-X1 member drop analysis for the period July-Nov (see chart) more members have been dropped for non- payment of dues, followed by members in good standing resigning. We can control this. Club Presidents need to work with members having difficulty to pay dues or members not paying because of dissatisfaction with the clubs. Flexible payment schedule has to be considered. Special attention to focus on why members in good standing are leaving. Non- Attendance is not a criterion to drop a member as long as they are paying dues. December drop is not available yet.



Current Clubs Status: 2-X1 currently has 12 clubs with <10 members. They need help from the district to rejuvenate these clubs. We have 36 clubs with no membership activity in the last five months. Need to conduct membership events. There is one club on status quo. Zone Chairs need to work with these clubs and help them fulfill their financial obligations. Allen Club has been cancelled.

Mission 1.5: Goal is to increase Global Lion’s Clubs membership to be 1.5 million by June 2027. This is not just a number. We want to increase our service worldwide and need more hands to serve. Our current membership is about 1.358 million. We have about one and half years to achieve that goal.

District 2-X1 Lions! Happy New Year!

Half of the Lion Year is over! But a LOT of important events are still to come before July 1st.

1. **LCI Service: January 3rd thru the 11th** is one of the three LCI “Weeks of Service”. This is the second service week and is designated for clubs to provide a “Hunger” service project which must be completed within those dates and reported on the Lion Portal to count towards the 2025-2026 LCI Club Excellence Award. Plan something for that first
2. Continue working toward earning the LCI 2025-2026 Club Excellence Award which requires: A minimum of 10% of the club’s members must complete **any three** courses found in the Lions Learning Center (inside the Lions Portal). There are numerous course options available, any of which count.
3. **January 17th Mid-Winter Conference/3rd Cabinet Meeting** will have learning sessions for officers and Membership and Service Chairs. However, officer qualification training **will not be** offered as Jan. 17th is after the LCI cutoff date of Dec. 31st for

officer training. Note that there will be a Jason’s Deli lunch **so pre-registration** is required if you plan to have lunch. See the registration form and instructions on the District web site

www.lionsdistrict2x1.org.

4. **District 2-X1 District Convention** in Duncanville on April 24th and 25th. See the registration form and instructions on the District web site www.lionsdistrict2x1.org.
5. **District 2-X1 Picnic** May 3rd - Watch for details.
6. **District 2-X1 Lions University**. June 21st - Watch for details. Make sure your incoming officers (President, First Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer received their training for a better year and for Lion Officer training credit towards the 2026-2027 LCI Club Excellence Award.


