West Region Overview

The West Region continues to serve the community with strong commitment through Lions and Leos across multiple causes, while also working toward strengthening membership growth and improving reporting participation.

1) Membership Status:

- Total Lions Clubs: 24
- Total Leo Clubs: 6
- Total Lions Members (01/10/2026): 649
- Total Members Last Year: 692
- Members Added This Year: 43
- Members Dropped This Year: 108
- Net Gain/Loss: -65 (Loss)

2) Service Reporting & Activity Impact

West Region clubs are actively participating in service projects, fundraising, and volunteering activities; however, service reporting completion still needs improvement to reflect the true impact of our clubs.

Service Reporting Summary

- Lions & Leos Service Report Completion: 60%
- Service Reported by Total Clubs (District level): 50 Lions Clubs
- Service Reported in West Region: 18 out of 24 clubs
- Service Not Reported: 6 clubs
- Overall Activity Count (West Region): 522 Activities

3) LCIF Contributions

The region has demonstrated meaningful support toward LCIF; however, more clubs can participate to strengthen our district's impact globally.
