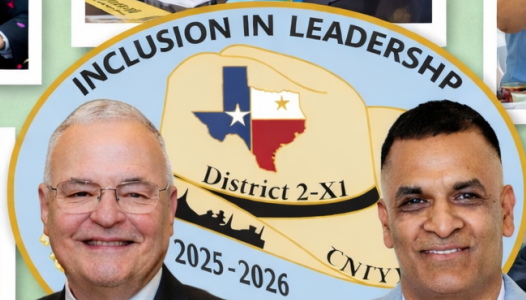

April is one of the most important months in the Lions year as clubs focus on completing major service goals, strengthening membership, and preparing for leadership transitions beginning July 1. It is a time of reflection and reevaluation what have you and your club accomplished so far, and what can still be improved? Lions Clubs International President A. P. Singh has emphasized key global service priorities including Hunger (Jan 3–11), Mental Health Awareness (Oct 4–12), and Environment (April 18–26), encouraging clubs to actively participate in meaningful service projects that address real community needs.

These global priorities are also part of the Club Excellence Award criteria, making April the ideal time to review progress, complete planned service activities, and ensure all service reports are properly submitted in the Lions Portal. Earth Day on April 22 further reminds us of our responsibility to protect the environment, one of Lions Clubs International’s major causes. Clubs should also ensure that newly elected officers are updated in the Lions Portal by April 15, which is essential for leadership continuity and recognition eligibility.

District 2-X1 will host its District Convention on April 24–25, 2026, providing valuable opportunities to learn, share ideas, build fellowship, and celebrate

achievements. This convention carries historic importance as the district prepares to support Past Council Chair John Landrum for the International Director candidacy for 2027–2028, a rare opportunity after 72 years since Dr. Richard A. Dick (1954–1956) represented District 2-X1 on the LCI Board of Directors. Clubs should assign voting delegates, complete mandatory registration, and ensure dues are paid on time to maintain good standing and voting privileges.

Lions are encouraged to support LCIF contributions, even small amounts such as \$10, demonstrating discipline and commitment to global service. Every contribution strengthens our global network of 1.4 million Lions serving communities around the world. Leaders should also prepare for upcoming opportunities including the State Convention, International Convention, DGE Summit in Atlanta (June 19–21), and District 2-X1 Lions University on June 20 for Presidents, Secretaries, Treasurers, Membership Chairs, Service Chairs, Marketing Chairs, and LCIF Coordinators. April can truly be called the month of Service, Leadership, and Membership reevaluation.

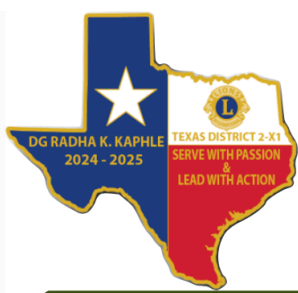

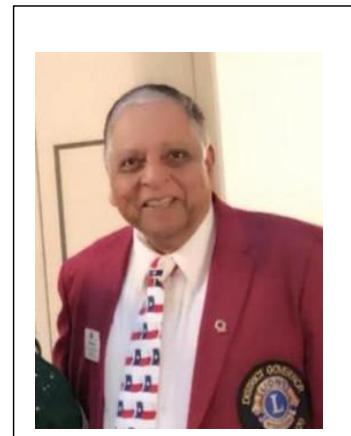

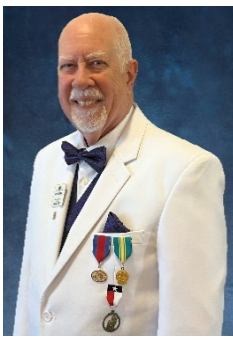

Club Officer training is coming! Save the June 20th date!

Please also note that April 18th thru April 26th is the third LCI “Week of Service” for this Lion Year. Performing all three “Week of Service” projects is a requirement for LCI’s 2025-2026 Club Excellence award. *This week deals with an Environment service project. A District service project of electronic trash (old electronics and batteries) will be held at the District Convention. Your club’s participation satisfies this requirement.*

Important items before June 30th!

1. **Recruit new members!** Hold an open house meeting. Invite your non-Lion friends. Then conduct a New Member Orientation as soon as possible after they join. Need help to do an orientation, call me.
2. Encourage a minimum of 10% of the club’s members to complete **any three** courses found in the Lions Learning Center (“Learn” inside the Lions Portal). Numerous courses are available, both Lion and management oriented, of which any 3 counts.
3. **Donate to LCIF.** For Club Excellence, clubs must contribute a minimum of \$20 per member. Also, consider a personal donation which counts toward your own Melvin Jones Fellowship and the club’s donation. You don’t have \$20 per member? Do a fund raiser for LCIF and/or your other charities.
4. Attend the **District 2-X1 District Convention** in Duncanville on April 24th and 25th. The registration form and instructions are on <https://lionsdistrict2x1.org>.
5. Attend the **District 2-X1 Picnic** May 9th – Info is also on <https://lionsdistrict2x1.org>. This is a fun event for all of us to have a good time.
6. Attend the **District 2-X1 Lions University**. Saturday, June 20th - Officer training for your incoming Presidents, First Vice Presidents, Secretaries, Treasurers and training for your Membership, Service, LCIF, and Marketing chairs earning credit towards the 2026-2027 LCI Club Excellence Award. 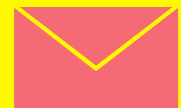

It's spring, and Texas Lions Camp is gearing up for summer camp! It was great to see almost 200 Lions and Leos brave much-needed rain to participate in the March 7 Work Day. Some 260 Lions and Leos served despite strong winds at the March 28 clean-up! Thanks for your service! By May, the new pre-fabricated cabins should be in place, so on May 2, Lions will have the opportunity to “see” the changes resulting from the demolition of the structures this fall.

Camper Registration – Let's Step It Up!

As of March 25, TLC has registered a total of 521 participants, of which 379 are attending family camp. **With only 142 children registered for residential youth camp, Lions need to step up recruitment efforts.** As you may remember, TLC was created in 1949 to provide a summer camping experience for children with polio. Over the decades, TLC opened its doors to children with all types of disabilities, and in the early '70s added Type 1 diabetic campers. This is our history and our legacy, as TLC has hosted more than 87,000 campers since its inception. Summer camp is why TLC exists, and our job as Lions is to **recruit campers!** The children are out there – we just have to make sure they know TLC exists.

Harry Wickersham Golf Tournament

July 30 is coming up soon! Teams of golfers are encouraged to register now for the 33rd Annual Harry Wickersham Golf Tournament at Lady Bird Johnson Municipal Golf Course in Fredericksburg. Honoring PDG Ed Stebbins Past TLC Chairman/ Golf Tournament Founder



This **Ed Stebbins Memorial Golf Dinner** honors the late 2001-02 Chairman of the Texas Lions Camp Board and PDG for District 2-E2. At a 1992 TLC Board Meeting, Stebbins proposed to turn an informal Lions golf outing into an annual fund-raising tournament. Since its inception in 1993, the tournament has raised more than \$2 million to support Texas Lions Camp operations!



Stebbins recommended that the tournament be named for Lion Harry Wickersham, the real golfer in the original foursome, which also included Mike Butler, Marshall Cooper and Bruce Rickert. Stebbins also recruited Lion Lester Frantzen and the Fredericksburg Lions Club to help organize and operate the tournament, which they have done for more than 30 years!



In 1998, Stebbins and Past International Director Ray Hughston rode their bikes 1,515 miles from the state convention in College Station to the LCI international convention in San Diego, California, raising \$150,000 for TLC. The dedication of leaders like Stebbins and Hughston have ensured that TLC continues to serve Texas children with special medical conditions at no charge to the camper/family, and provide fun activities while building self-confidence and self-esteem.

Stebbins and his late wife, Past International Director and PDG Beverly Stebbins, were Lions for more than 30 years. Lionism was central to their lives, and they wanted to make a difference for others. That the Harry Wickersham Golf Tournament continues 32 years later shows the difference Ed Stebbins and his leadership have made on TLC. The addition of corporate sponsorships in 2018 and live and silent auctions have expanded the event statewide. New features and activities will continue to increase the financial support the tournament provides for camp operations.

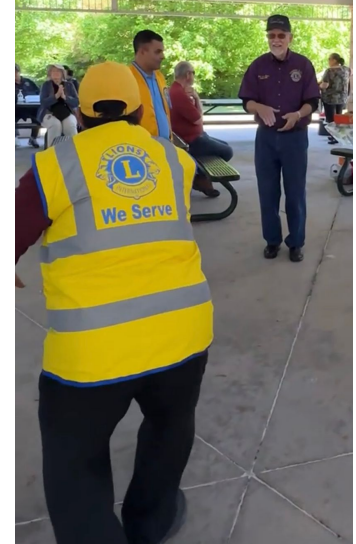
